Super Science!

Design a bright, colourful and informative poster to give children a clear message about how to stay safe around electricity.

- Place wires and leads in a safe place
- Do not leave electrical appliances and devices on or when you are out of the house.

English

Write an instruction text using the features you have learned in class.

Choose something that you enjoy doing – for example

An instruction for your favourite recipe or instructions how to play a sport or a game.

Make sure to include – A list of ingredients or materials List the instructions using numbers or bullet points. Include imperative verbs. E.g. Stir, Mix, Add, Pour

Marvellous Maths!

Practice your formal calculation strategies.

- Generate 2, 4-digit numbers and add them using column addition.
- Generate a 4 digit and a 3-digit number and find the difference between the two, using column subtraction.
- Using short multiplication find the product of a 3-digit number and a 1-digit number.
- Use short division to calculate the following
 - 1. $783 \div 3$
 - 2. $435 \div 5$
 - 3. $368 \div 4$
 - 4. $602 \div 7$

Fabulous French!

Teach your family to have a short conversation in French.

Use the phrases you have been learning this year. For example – Hello, how are you? Where do you live? How old are you? You can also teach you family to count to 50. Introduce the names of different family members. Mum, Dad, brother, sister, Grandmother, Grandfather, Uncle, Aunt, cousin.

RE - Identity and belonging
